Trivia: Have you ever wondered.....

Jesus called the common fishermen to leave everything and become his disciples as "fishers of men." (e.g. **Luke 5:10)** Fishing was a common and necessary job, so the fishing analogy likely helped to bridge the gap in Jesus' followers' understanding.

- 1. What kind of fish did Jesus eat?
- 2. Do fishermen still fish in the Sea of Galilee or the Jordan River?
- 3. How were the fish transported, saved, and eaten?
- 4. How do the reported experts know this information?
- 5. If the Sea of Galilee is the second-lowest lake in the world, what is the lowest? (And what is the highest?)

The Sea of Galilee, also called Lake Tiberias or Kinneret(h) is a freshwater lake in Israel. It is the lowest freshwater lake on Earth and the second-lowest lake in the world. It is fed partly by underground springs, but its main source is the Jordan River.

Trivia Answers:

- 1. What kind of fish did Jesus eat? Of the 27 species of fish in the Sea of Galilee, 10 are prized by fishermen. These 10 species divide into three categories: the Kinneret sardine, the biny (or barbel), and the musht. Of these the sardine is generally too small to catch in a net and they were usually reserved for pickling, and we know that the apostles cooked their fish on the fire. We need to find fish that are large enough to be caught in a net, and too big for the apostles to hoist out of the water. The biny is large enough as they can grow to about 4' and weigh up to 25 lbs. However, they require bait to catch and thus a hook and line rather than a net. The musht is a type of tilapia that exists in five species within the Sea of Galilee. One of these varieties reaches about a foot-and-a-half long, weighing 4-5 lbs. A haul of 153 musht could weigh upwards of 750 lbs, which could explain why the apostles could not pull the net from the water. The musht is generally identified as among the most commonly caught fish of the biblical era and hauls of them would be brought in by net.
- 2. **Do fishermen still fish in the Sea of Galilee or the Jordan River?** More than 2,000 tons of fish are caught in the Sea of Galilee annually, including musht, sardine, biny, and catfish.
- 3. **How were the fish transported, saved, and eaten?** Often fish were brought to the marketplace dried, salted, or smoked.
- 4. **How do the reported experts know this information?** Fish bones. "The rich assortment of fish consumed by Jerusalemites during the First Temple period points to a community interested in maintaining multiple sources of food through diverse sources of commerce. Nehemiah in describing the reconstruction of the walls of Jerusalem explicitly mentions the fish gate (שַׁעַר הַדָּגִים; Neh 3:3), which likely functioned as a fish market.
- 5. **If the Sea of Galilee is the second-lowest lake in the world, what is the lowest?** The Dead Sea is the lowest. Lake Titicaca is the highest freshwater lake in the world (in the Andes' border of Peru and Bolivia).
