### **Hierological Considerations**

- 1. There are six elements on the Seder Plate:
- Matzah (unleavened bread)
- Zeroa (shankbone)
- Beitzah (egg)
- Maror or Chazeret (bitter herbs)
- Charoset (paste)
- Karpas (vegetable)
- 2. Haroset ("charoset," חרוסת) is a mixture of fruit, nuts, and honey. It is sometimes tart, always sweet, and often chunky, frequently containing wine and cinnamon. It is to help remember the mortar used to make the bricks for building of Egyptian cities.
- 3. Ahavah (ah-hah-VAH) אהבה is the Hebrew noun for "love." Todah (toe-DAH) תודה is Hebrew for gratitude or acknowledgment: this is the modern word for "thank you." Shalom (shah-LOME) שלום "peace" or "wellbeing." It also can be used for both "hello" and "goodbye." Chag Sameach (KHAG PAY-sock sah-MEY-akh) חַג שָׂמַחַ is the Hebrew equivalent of saying "happy holidays." To make the phrase Passover specific, add "Pesach:" "Chag Pesach Sameach."
- 4. **The Jerusalem Council** was a meeting of church leadership convened between 45 and 55AD to settle doctrinal disputes related to the inclusion of non-Jews into the church.

The Council of Nicaea (AD 325) was the first council intended to address the entire body of believers, convened by the emperor Constantine to resolve the controversy of Arianism, which held that Christ was not divine but was a created being. It resulted in the Nicaean Creed. It was then that Constantine proclaimed Easter the official celebration in lieu of Passover.

At the **Third Synod of Carthage** (AD 397) the council set forth the first listing of all 27 books of the New Testament canon together with 46 books of the Old testament.
