WHAT'S GREAT ABOUT MAY?

In early America, the month of May afforded believers opportunities to integrate their faith into both private and public observances. Many of these opportunities remain today. Christian patriots can observe the National Day of Prayer, honor the role of motherhood, and on Memorial Day, remember those who died defending our freedoms - freedom to worship, among others.

- May 10, 1775 was the first prayer in Congress (during the Second Continental Congress convening in Philadelphia).
- May 14, 33 is noted as the date of the ascension of Jesus Christ.
- May 24, 1738 was Aldersgate Day, which marked the conversion of John Wesley.
- Pentecost is observed May 28th this year; it is remembered as the birthday of the Christian Church.

TRADITIONS

The secular understanding of a tradition like celebrating Mother's Day or observing Memorial Day comprises an established custom or belief that is passed down from one generation to the next. These traditions can generate a sense of belonging within a community; traditions build unity.

Traditions also creep into the religious sphere, for example some churches celebrate The Lord's Supper on the first Sunday of each month. Saying grace before a meal also might be viewed as a tradition; affirming thanks to God for the day's bounty certainly is among the easiest and most appropriate traditions to maintain in our hearts and homes!

Hierological Considerations - answers

1. Jesus' Height: A 2001 study by a team of Israeli and British forensic anthropologists and computer programmers examined a skull from the 1st century to better understand the characteristics of ancient people. 2. Adam's belly button. In the beginning, God created Adam from clay and breathed life into him. Sadly, some doubters have questions, such as Adam's navel. For hundreds of years, scenes of the Garden of Eden have populated religious art. This has left artists with a dilemma: should Adam and Eve have belly buttons? Would God have given Adam a navel for purely aesthetic reasons? Some artists fudged the question by extending fig leaves over the lower abdomen, some painted them smooth-bellied, and some decided that the first humans did indeed have navels. This argument remains unsettled!

3. God does not love Satan. God cannot love that which is evil and unholy, and Satan embodies all of that. He is everything that God hates. Revelation 20 describes God's future plan for Satan, and love for Satan has no part in it. Jesus' command that we love our enemies is meant to govern interpersonal relationships in this world. We love people (even our enemies), who are made in God's image. Angels are not made in God's image. We are never told to love the holy angels, and we are certainly never told to love the evil angels.
